
Discipleship Strategy for the Family



Where discipleship begins: at Home

Discipleship is supposed to begin in the home and more than that, the home is supposed to be the primary place of discipleship (Deut 6). That is the long and short of it. You do not have to have a Bible degree to lead discipleship at home. You simply have to be willing to put in time and effort because discipleship happens intentionally.

Here are some elements of Discipleship at home that have been noted as particularly crucial:

- Regular Bible reading (this is most significant)
- Regular times of prayer
- Regular service in the church and community
- Regular singing of Christian songs/songs of praise to God

Other notable elements:

- Participation in missions trips/service projects
- Proclaiming the Gospel to unbelievers
- Asking forgiveness after sinning
- Tithing
- Teaching others

What is encouraging is that less emphasis is put on how these elements were done and more on the fact that they were done. If needed, do not be afraid to ask other Christians or your pastor(s) for ideas inside each of these elements. One note is that the above elements were participated in by parents and children.
